Jainning Shan is President of NZ China Union of Culture and Art.

He is a skilled artist and Calligrapher, having loved painting since he was a child. He was a soldier, then became a college teacher, magazine editor and researcher specializing in economics.

He settled in Christchurch in 2014, setting up a personal studio and has continued his love of painting. He paints in a traditional Chinese water Ink style and has enjoved developing this skill further in the lovely surroundings of Christchurch and New Zealand. These provide inspiration to his work.

He is also President of the Painting and Calligraphy Academy for Jiangsu overseas-based Chinese artists.

He continues to be a member of the Nanjing Artists Association and a Director of the Jiangsu Province Civil Servants Calligraphy and Painting Association.

He is also Vice President of Wan Xizhi Painting and Calligraphy Academy.



WeiNian Chi

Weinian Chi, is an experienced senior marine engineer who in recent years has entered the art world. He is a member of the Dalian Artists Association, a member of and creative researcher for the Chinese Elderly Painting Research Association, and a member of the Art Committee of New Zealand/China Confederation.

In recognition of his ability, the Dalian Xinghua Painting Academy invited him to be a special artist. To date, more than 100 of his art works have been published or purchased by professional artist organizations and newspapers and galleries in China, Japan, North America, Britain and New Zealand. His works have also been shown at international exhibitions many times.



BianYing Yang

Bianying Yang is an artist from China who paints in two styles. The first is Gongbi, a traditional Chinese style that uses fine brush strokes to delimit details very precisely and with little expressive variation. This style requires dedication and commitment and so, in ancient China, only the wealthiest families could afford to employ such an artist. Bianying Yang works in this traditional style to show the delicate skills and unique culture of China.

The second style that Bianying Yang practices is XieYi, a Chinese freehand painting tradition. The essence of freehand brush painting is the expression of the spiritual characteristics of the subject matter. The peony, the national flower of China, features in much XieYi art, including that of Bianying Yang, who describes it as her favourite flower. Her aim is to capture the brightness and extravagance of this "queen of flowers".
